

Regulations

1. The show is held under the auspices of the Exmoor Pony Society and its rules and regulations are to be abided by.
2. Please remember to bring your pony's passport as required by the horse passport legislation.
3. All colts and stallions 2 years and over MUST be bitted, and entire males aged 3yrs and over must be in possession of either a breed society or ministry of Agriculture Licence.
4. Any pony not under proper control or showing signs of contagious disease will be asked to leave the show ground.
5. Judges decision is final in all classes. Objections are not encouraged; remember it is a fun show to promote the breed. If complaints must be made they should be made to the secretary of the show within ½ hour of the incident being complained about and accompanied by a £50 deposit which will be donated to charity.
6. Equine vaccinations are not compulsory but it is strongly recommended that all equines are vaccinated equine influenza and tetanus.
7. The show organisers, owners of the site or any other official will not accept any responsibility for any loss, damage etc of any exhibitors possessions or animals it is recommended that all exhibitors have appropriate third party insurance, and exhibit at their own risk.
8. Dogs are welcome on the ground but must be kept on the lead at all times and any dog mess must be picked up. Dogs are not allowed into the canteen.
9. **Entries close 27th June 2010**, and the entry fee for each entry is £5. Entries on the day are £7 unless the pony is already entered in another class in which case they will remain at £5. Entries on the day will not appear in the catalogue.
10. Numbers will be provided on the day, please contact the show secretary on arrival at the showground. A small number of catalogues will be available on the day.
11. Classes may be split depending on the number of entries received.
12. Exmoor Pony Society rosettes will be presented to society members only.
13. Please can all visitors ensure that they follow the signs for Badgworth Arena and do not go through the village of Badgworth which is very narrow.

The day is intended as a mix of serious showing and a fun social. Please use the opportunity to socialise, and most of all have a fun day out. There is onsite catering at Badgworth arena and there will also be a selection of Friends of Exmoor Pony merchandise for sale. There will also be a raffle on the day prize donations are welcomed.

NPS Mountain and Moorland Qualifying Rounds: These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain and Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible.

Qualifying rounds are open to ponies owned by NPS members and non-members and as this is a breed show ponies can qualify for the final even if their owners are not NPS members. The highest placed pony in each class will qualify for the final. Where this pony has already qualified the pony standing next in line and has not already qualified receives the qualification. Qualification may go no lower than 3rd place. The owner of the pony must become an Adult/Showing member to enter the final at the NPS Summer Championship Show at Malvern from 4-6th August 2010.

Morning – Judge Mr. David Brewer

Class 1 (to start at 9:30)

Novice pony and Novice Handler (no colts/stallions) – Neither the pony or handler to have been placed 1st in a show. Only the ring craft of the handler will be taken into account. Class 2

1st Cross/Pony of Exmoor Type/X- registered pony, not registered in section 1 of the EPS studbook – Rosettes for ponies placed 1st-6th - **class kindly sponsored by Allen and Page horse feeds**
Ponies in class 1 and 2 not eligible for in-hand championship.

Class 12

Best pony bred in Somerset - **class kindly sponsored by Vetoquinol**

Class 13

Best pony bred outside Somerset - **class kindly sponsored by Vetoquinol**

Class 14

Lead rein pony. No stallions, lead rein must be attached to the noseband of the pony - **class kindly sponsored S. & I. Baker**

Class 15 The NPS/RHR Demolition Ltd M&M Junior Ridden National Championship (MM-JR)

Open to registered Exmoor Pony mares and geldings four years old and over. Riders must not have obtained their 14th birthday before 1st January in the current year - **class kindly sponsored by TWENTY2Dental**

Class 16 The NPS/Picton M&M Novice Ridden National Championship (MM-NR)

Open to pure bred registered Exmoor Pony stallions, mares and geldings four years old or over.

A pony is not eligible to compete if, before 1st January in the current year, it has done any of the following:

1. Won an open NPS affiliated M&M Ridden class.
2. Won a class at an Olympia, HOYS or RIHS qualifying round.
3. Qualified for HOYS or RIHS.
4. Qualified for the M&M Novice or Intermediate Ridden final at the NPS Summer Championship show.
5. Qualified for the M&M Ridden Championship final at Olympia in previous years or in the current year.

Class 17

Open ridden pony - **class kindly sponsored by Mesdames Williams & Nash**

Ring Two

Morning - Clear round jumping (not to start before 9:30) entries £2

Any pony entered in classes 1 – 19 may enter. Rosette for any pony achieving a clear round - **class kindly sponsored by Boehringer**

Class 18

Novice Working Hunter pony – **class kindly sponsored by Boehringer**
